## **Exports to China: domestic non-ferrous scrap industry under scrutiny**

In the framework of the overall waste shipment discussions resulting from the recently published EU Regulations Nr. 1013/2006 and 801/2007, another important issue has arisen.

BIR has been made aware that Chinese customs are carrying out intense investigations within the domestic non-ferrous scrap industry since the government suspects that some market participants avoid paying full duties and other tariffs by means of mis-declaration of values and/or metallic content of scrap.

Anti-smuggling units from various jurisdictions have visited a number of scrap yards in various parts of the country. In an attempt to secure evidence, customs have also requested information from some representative offices of foreign companies.

As a result of these investigations, port congestion has occurred and BIR

members report that buyers have been unable to clear customs properly.

Many rumours circulate regarding this investigation, and BIR endeavours to

find out more about the facts. As an international trade organisation, BIR must

refrain from commenting on internal investigative activities which are carried

out in another country in accordance with their laws. However, since this

situation has a direct impact on BIR members' businesses, BIR will continue to

monitor the situation and keep its members abreast of any progress in the

matter.

In the meantime, BIR members exporting to China are requested to strictly

follow all the rules and regulations pertinent to proper classification, grading

and documentary protocol. Details on regulations for shipments to China are

available on the BIR website www.bir.org.

Especially companies based in Europe or wishing to export recyclables/scrap

from an EU member state are advised to abide by the recently published EU

regulations (see latest BIR News and top banner on the BIR website).
