London Convention:BIR proposes a full programme of speakers

After a record attendance last May in Berlin, BIR is expecting another good turn-out on October (27) 28-29 at the Metropole Hilton Hotel in London.

The healthy number of registrations for our October Round-Table sessions has certainly been influenced by good business conditions and the easy accessibility of London, as well as by the desire among BIR members to hear more about market forecasts for 2005 and about the future raw materials needs of **China and India**.

BIR is once again proposing a full programme for the two days of the convention, with speakers at each commodity session and also two attractive workshops. Delegates will hear Chinese officials report at each plenary session on latest developments relating to **AQSIQ registration procedures**, while commodity experts will make guest presentations at each Round-Table session.
