## Joint Workshop

### "Prevention of Radioactive Contamination in Scrap Shredder Operations"

The BIR International Environment Council and the Shredder Committee have jointly organised a Workshop on Prevention of Radioactive Contamination in Scrap Shredder Operations, an item that has been highly topical in recent months. The workshop will take place on Tuesday, 28<sup>th</sup> October at 14.00 hrs in the InterContinental Hotel in Vienna.

This workshop will highlight recent incidents, their consequences for the scrap operations concerned, as well as possible solutions which, when implemented, can be a guarantee for increased security for the recycling companies.

The Chairman of the International Environment Council, Mr Alvaro Rodriguez

Martinez of Lajo & Rodriguez (Spain) will reinforce that it is vital to take measures

for the protection of scrap yards against the risk of radiological contamination due to

orphan sources in scrap. Mr Rodriguez will show the example of a specific case study

where such an incident has been documented with film and photo material.

Subsequently, Mr Paul Grothaus, Member of the Regional Board of Aon Jauch &
